

2012 BSU Teacher-Scholar Summer Institute Call for Pedagogy Track Theme Proposals

Description: From August 20 – 24, the Office of Teaching and Learning will hold the third BSU Teacher-Scholar Summer Institute, funded by a grant from the Davis Educational Foundation and BSU's Office of Academic Affairs. The goals of the Institute are:

- * Building a community of teacher-scholars
- * Generating energy and momentum among participants regarding teaching
- * Building interest in faculty development opportunities
- * Helping participants meet their own teaching and scholarship goals

Institute participants choose among three themes related to pedagogy. One of the strengths of the Institute is that the themes are developed and led by members of the BSU community. You are invited to propose and lead one of the three 2012 Institute's three pedagogical themes, focused around a particular pedagogical innovation or content area.

Facilitators apply in teams of at least two, one of whom must be a full-time BSU faculty member. Faculty facilitators receive \$3,000 each for developing and facilitating their track before and during the Institute and participate in general Institute planning and post-Institute assessment. Teams of more than two people may apply, in which case the total stipend will be shared. Administrators serving on facilitator teams do not receive stipends.

Applications will contain the following:

1. Initiative title and brief description of theme
2. Submitter Name(s)
3. Brief description of submitters' experience in faculty development
4. Description of the learning outcomes you wish to achieve with the faculty/librarians in your theme
5. Description of how you intend to accomplish these outcomes
6. Description of how these outcomes fulfill the goals of the Teacher-Scholar Institute and reflect the priorities of BSU's Strategic Plan
7. Draft schedule, including readings

Applications must not exceed two single-spaced pages, excluding draft schedule.

Deadline: Applications are due **Wednesday, February 22** via email attachment to Ann Brunjes (abrunjes@bridgew.edu).

Proposals will be reviewed by Ann Brunjes, Director of the Office of Teaching and Learning; Michelle Cox, WAC Director and Writing Retreat Facilitator; Andy Harris, Associate Provost for Faculty Affairs; and Karen Richardson, Office of Teaching and Learning Faculty Fellow.
